The following agenda points were discussed in detail and following resolutions were passed.

Subject No. 1: Briefing on the minutes of last meeting

Resolution: The members were briefed about "Minutes of IQAC meeting" dt. 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2023 and the "action taken report".

Subject No. 2: To review Value Aided Course on Advanced instruments handling and curriculum related feedback in 2022-23.

Resolution: The details noted were that more than 100 students have completed Value Aided Course on Advanced instruments handling and curriculum related feedback in 2022-23, was satisfactory.

Subject No. 3: Review of work related to CO-PO mapping, "content beyond syllabus" MOOCs -IKS, Guide allotment for B.Pharm. Sem-8 projects.

Resolution: PO attainment scores of graduating batch were noted. Various activities are discussed to support attainment of certain PO. It was resolved that Faculty should to be encouraged to take-up MOOCs related to Indian Knowledge Systems and Guides for Final Year B.Pharm. projects should be allotted in 7th Semester itself.

Subject No. 4: To discuss about In-house project competition and MOU/collaboration with NGO for extension activity.

Resolution: a) To conduct In-house projects competition for the projects completed in 22-23.
b) MOU in process with Harshdeep Foundation and Nayee Udaan NGO should be completed on priority.

Subject No. 5: To review Cleaning activity, Facility feedback by students, training to students on usage of library resources and up gradation of Infrastructure facility

Resolution: It was noted that scores for weekly cleaning monitoring in the first quarter of 2023-24 were in the range of 4.47 to 5.54. This shows improvement over last year.

b)It was noted that most of the facilities provided by the institute were rated more than 50% as very good with few exceptions like the boys and girls common room and canteen was rated needing improvement.
c) Currently we are accessing the bandwidth of 100 Mbps speed of internet. Considering the increased in the number of computers and number of students users, the current speed of internet achieving around 70-80 Mbps. It was resolved that we should increase the bandwidth of internet so browsing can be done without facing of any issue in opening of important sites like AICTE, SPPU, UGC, NAAC d)It was noted that User ID based internet connection is being used for safety.

Subject No. 6: To review students progression 2022-23 and methods adopted to increase alumni contribution.

Resolution: Students progression for the year 2022-23 was discussed. Details of the scholarships received by the students was presented. Students' achievement in competitive exams, students moving on to higher studies in and abroad was presented. Various ways to motivate the alumni to contribute in the growth of the institute was discussed.

Subject No. 7: To know about FDPs planned in AY 2023-24, status of IIQA & SSR, and Academic calendar review.

Resolution: a) It was decided to communicate with APTI and NAAC for FDP in collaboration. b)Activities were reviewed as per Academic calendar c) It was resolved to submit IIQA by end of Sept 2023 and AQAR as per time limit of NAAC.


