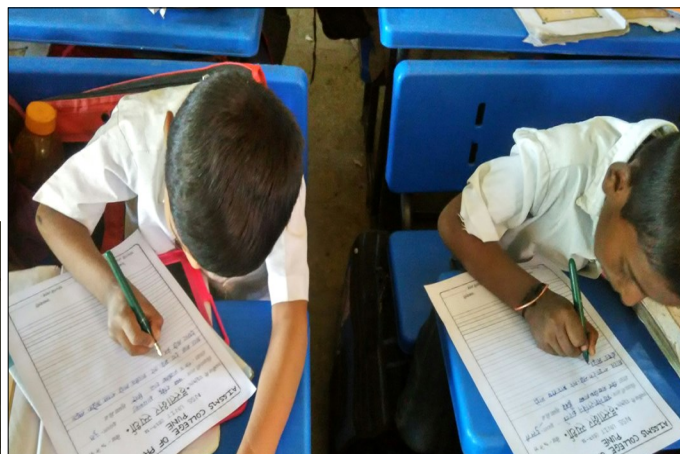

Effect of Tumor Necrosis Factor (TNF-alpha) on Cancerous Cells-

- Tumor necrosis factor is cytokine which is capable of inducing the death of tumor cells that could lead to severe inflammation.
- Its primary role is to regulate immune cells and direct them towards inflammation sites in the body.
- TNF inhibits the growth and spread of tumor cells. It also triggers necrosis or cell death.

Bananas contain modest amounts of several compounds with known anti-cancer activities, including alpha-carotene, beta-carotene, melatonin and dopamine.

Components of bananas have been shown to inhibit proliferation of leukemia and liver cancer cells in the laboratory.

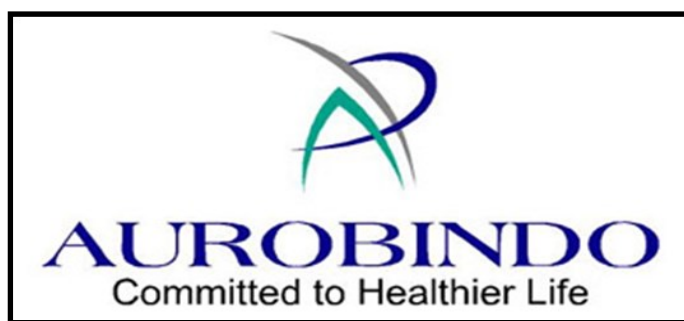

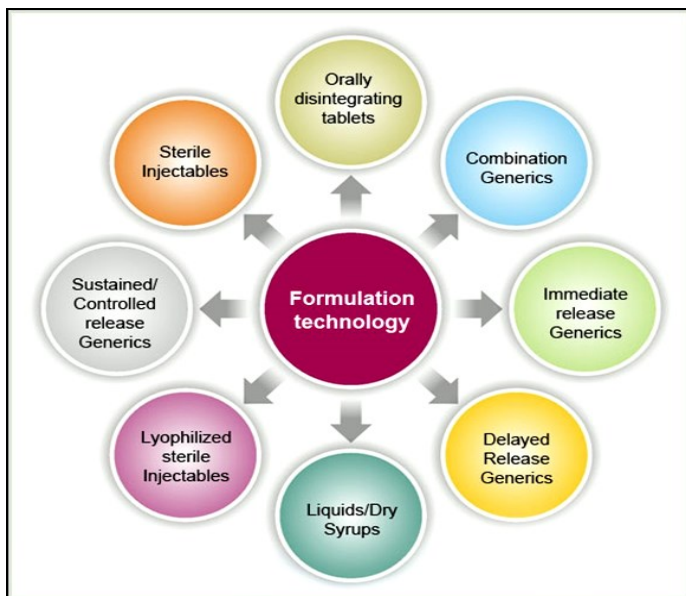
