



# DID YOU KNOW: 3D ORGAN-ON-CHIP CAN NOW REPLACE ANIMAL TESTING!



An **organ-on-a-chip** (**OOC**) is a multi-channel 3-D chip that mimics the activities, mechanics and physiological response of entire organs and organ systems, like it is a type of artificial organ. It is fabricated using microfluidic technology either by photolithography or softlithography techniques and contains micro channels with living human cells lined on the chips made from different polymers and are in size of a memory card. The bioinks which can be



customised to create tissue constructs containing multiple cell types in forms of barriers, protein structures, vascularised tissues and external force is applied to mimic the response.

In-vivo testing has given real time analysis over in-vitro of the drug interactions and kinetics within a body and hence we are using animals which have similar body functions to humans.

But it seems a tedious, costly and complex process beginning from the selection of right animal for testing to its sample collection and interpretation of results which may show error due to physiological differences in similar group of animals. Hence the chips are preferable as they are

- •reusable
- •can be printed on chips in desired dimensions and functions
- •quick results and less manual interference
- •Integration of the two technologies presents a promising direction for high-throughput drug validation



The different types of chips such as Human-on-chip, liver-on-chip, heart-on-chip, skin-on-chip kidney-on-chip, placenta on chip and lungs-on-chip are available commercially.

And more newer advances like the 4D printing which gives the actual representation of the organ has been developed and shall come into practice very soon,

The cost for one chip is although 25, 000/- but it proves



beneficial by saving the cost of animals their dosing and habitation, testing, documentation is electronically interpreted and the lesser equipments required for experimentation thus showing us a promising future for in-vitro testing.

- Graduate in pharmacy and bio-sciences
- Junior professional in Pharmaceutical industry, IT Industry and Clinical Research Organisations.

#### ♦ Eligibility Criteria: -

In order to pursue a career in pharmacovigilance, the minimum eligibility criteria to apply for the course is:

- A postgraduate or graduate degree in Bioscience/Life Sciences (with any of the following subjects: Botany, Zoology, Biochemistry, Microbiology, Genetics, Biotech) with at least 50% marks in aggregate
- A postgraduate or graduate degree with Chemistry as a subject with at least 50% marks in aggregate
- A postgraduate or graduate degree in Pharmacy or Pharmaceutical Sciences
- A postgraduate or graduate degree in Medicine



The selection process is based on merit. Admission is granted only to students who have cleared a written examination and a personal interview.

#### ♦ Salary:-

# 1. Could you kindly provide glimpse of your organization? What role do you play in the organization?

Currently, I work independently in the field of market research. Sector agnostic. This means I do market research projects across various sectors pharma, healthcare, financial services, social research, etc. I work directly with clients (end user), consulting firms, and research agencies.

#### My role:

It is varied and depends with whom I work.

When directly working with clients, I have to take care of the research project start to end. Which means proposal making to execution of the research project till the final presentation of results.

When I work with consulting houses / research agencies then it could be moderation, project management, analysis, report writing. In parts or all together. In market research terminology, moderation means conducting interviews, group discussions, panels.

#### 2. Could you brief us about your educational details? Both school life and University life.

B. Pharm Sci. from Prin. K.M. Kundanani College of Pharmacy, Mumbai (KMKCP, Mumbai) MMS - Master of Management Sciences (with specialisation in Marketing) from Vivekanand Education Society Institute of Management Studies & Research, Mumbai (VESIMSR, Mumbai) SSC and HSC – Maharashtra state board – from Thane district, Mumbai

#### 3. How did you break into the field you are in today?

Initially post B. Pharm graduation I worked in the pharma industry in QC/QA department for 6 months or so and then in the same company got promoted in Formulation development/R&D department. Furthermore, I worked with another company again in Formulation department for close to a year.

After 3 years of working in pharma industry, I wanted to explore further. Thus, joined Management



college by giving the entrance test, group discussion and personal interview. I went for a full-time post-graduation as only that was feasible for me at that point. There are part-time management courses too however logistically it wasn't possible for me with work, home and college at another place. It was a big decision then to quit job and going back for studies. Nonetheless no regrets. During my management course, since I had very good experience of 3 years, I was very clear what I wanted to do further as a job. Post 2 years of management education, I went for market research. It was a campus placement that I got through. I did apply for product management as well however market research felt interesting to me. Thus, as soon as I got the offer letter, I accepted it.

I have been specifically in market research for close to two decades now. Out of which I worked almost 12 years with the same company where I began my market research career. Then worked briefly with another company for a year. Now it's been 6 to 6.5 years that I am working independently. The company I joined post my management was a boutique consulting outfit which worked across all sectors – financial services, FMCG, social research and when I joined developed pharma and healthcare research too. Still continue in the same field.

I have taught at few management colleges (graduate as well as post-graduate management colleges) to introduce the practicality of market research subject which is part of their course.

#### 4. What are the most interesting and/or current developments in your field?

Technology has been used well in our field for conducting surveys. Earlier we have mainly pen and paper methods. Now there are various method through which we collect data. CATI, CAPI, Mobile surveys, etc. I have conducted research using these tools. Even for analysis, there are softwares which help in analysing and projecting the data the way we want.

# 5. Given the current circumstances, what do you feel about pursuing higher studies in the Healthcare field in a foreign country i.e. USA, Canada etc?

Personally, I never planned to pursue higher studies in foreign countries. From hearsay and friends' or colleagues' experiences, these markets have various opportunities and universities where students can look forward to do higher studies. It will be better if someone who has experienced the same can comment further on this.

# 6. What kind of opportunities does the Indian market promise as compared to foreign markets e.g North America/Europe?

Personally, I don't have any experience working in the North America/Europe. Although I have worked with clients across various countries. I have friends working in the US and Canada who are into Data analytics, Market research, etc.

- ◆ Medical coding (text into numbers)/ Medical transcription (voice to text)

I have seen my colleagues with 5 years of experience have gone abroad for further work experience in the space of market research. Experience gained here did help them with opportunities abroad.

# 7. Do you believe it is a good time to start up on your own- here in India? Or do you suggest the job security of a conventional 9-5 job?

Yes, it is good to start up on your own in India however some initial organizational experience helps.

#### 8. What do you see lacking in young recruits today? What improvements would you suggest?

Mostly from my experience, I have seen young recruits looking for desk jobs, avoiding field work. Thus, missing out on the opportunities further like marketing/product management/market research. A young recruit should appear interviews with an open mind and be eager to learn and explore. Only then one will understand their skills and can better themselves for further opportunities. Discipline, sincerity and good communication skills are must.

I am not in touch with the current syllabus of Pharmacy course and unable to comment on it.

#### 10. What is your message to young graduates/postgraduates in Pharmacy ...

Do explore the various areas/opportunities before shortlisting. They should interact with seniors, industry people and understand better.
