

Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj born on 26<sup>th</sup> June 1874. He worked for the poor. He made compulsory primary education to all regardless of caste and creed. Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj was considered a true democrat and social reformer. Shahu Maharaj was an able ruler who was associated with many progressive policies during his rule. From his coronation in 1894 till his demise in 1922.

Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj also worked for betterment of the conditions of women in his empire. He opened schools to educate the women, and also spoke vociferously on the topic of women education. He made a law banning the Devadsi Pratha, the practice of offering girls to God, which essentially led to exploitation of the girls in the hands of the Clergy. He legalised widow remarriages in 1917 and made efforts towards stopping child marriages.



#### Did You Know:

It is a zoonotic virus (it is transmitted from animals to humans). The organism that causes Nipah Virus encephalitis is an RNA or Ribonucleic acid virus of the family Paramyxoviridae, genus Henipavirus, and is closely related to Hendra virus. Hendra virus (HeV) infection is a rare emerging zoonosis that causes severe and often fatal diseases in both infected horses and humans.

It first broke out in Malaysia and Singapore in 1998 and 1999.

The disease is named after a village in Malaysia, Sungai Nipah, where it was first detected. It first appeared in domestic pigs and has been found among several species of domestic animals including dogs, cats, goats, horses and sheep.

#### **Transmission:-**

The disease spreads through fruit bats or 'flying foxes,' of the genus Pteropus, who are natural reservoir hosts of the Nipah and Hendra viruses.

The virus is present in bat urine and potentially, bat faeces, saliva, and birthing fluids.

The human infection presents as an encephalitic syndrome marked by fever, headache, drowsiness, disorientation, mental confusion, coma, and potentially death.
