Description of Activity:

Volunteers of National Service Scheme and staff visited village Khubavali in Mulshi Taluka to help farmers in rice plantation. Agriculture forms the foundation and backbone of Indian socioeconomic system. Mulshai and western regions of Pune district farmers grow rice as the major crop. The human resources available for the agricultural activities is limited to family members of the farmers only and due to poor economy they can't afford to hire labors.

Therefore this activity was designed to provide the manpower of volunteers of the National Service Scheme (NSS) to help the farmers. It was also aimed to provide the opportunity to students to study the farming activities, process and understand the rural economy. The activities were focused on intense observations and analysis of the socioeconomic profile of farm families in rural area, participatory extension approach and acquaintance with farming situations, farm practices and interaction with progressive farmers.

Activity highlights:

1. The site: Students reached village khubavali early morning at 7am using college bus.

- 2. Basic education: Local farmer Mr. Kiran Satpute and his family briefed the studentsabout how rice farming is done. They were shown the seedling plot where rice crops are germinated in bulk by throwing seeds and then transported to the main field for plantation.
- 3. Plantation of the seedlings: Students removed the grown seedlings, divided them into small bunches as instructed by the farmers and carried them to the main field. The main field was converted into a mud plot. The seedlings were then planted into the main plant in straight lines.
- 4. Area of work: Rice plantation was done over an area of 3.5 acres.

Learning about the harvesting process: The team was educated by the farmers about the crop duration and harvesting process. They were introduced to the milling process and forecasted yield of the rice grains.
